HOMWORK HELPERS



We are Homework Helpers from Jackson County Youth Leadership Council (YLC), a 4-H club. Youth Leadership Council is a youth-led organization that aims to support the community through service and the development of young leaders.

This spring, YLC is organizing a service project to help local elementary and middle school students with their homework and prepare them for rounding out the school year.

We plan to assist 2nd-8th grade students with their class work, provide homework tips and skills, and serve as upperclassmen mentors for students who decide to sign up! Our structure will largely depend on the interest we receive from students, but for now we will divide our sessions based on grade level. Many YLC members have voiced interest in helping these young students, so there will be at least two homework helpers and two supervising adults, who have been background checked, conducting each session.

The Homework Helpers program is set to start the first full week of April and meet on Sundays and Wednesdays at 5:30 pm; sessions should last around an hour. Our program will be free of cost!
